Turf is the Cinderella of earth building in the UK, long forgotten and almost vanished, but it was a historically a key construction materia until the 19th century. Recently there has been a surge in recording on archaeological sites, renewed interest in the skills and diversity this tradition, and recognition of its wider bio-regional context.
